Seeking support for your child at CPS



At Cooma Public School we continually reflect on what we do and how we do it so we can better meet the needs of our students, parents and the wider school community. We have a comprehensive group of staff that have specialist roles in the school designed to support your child and your family with all aspects of schooling. We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of some of the key avenues through which they can make connections with the school and seek support when needed.

Front Office

The front office is your first point of contact for Cooma Public School. We have a very dedicated and friendly office team consisting of Mandy, Monique and Cherie. They are here to assist you in the day to day organsiation for your child. You can contact them to report absences or with any questions you may have and they will be able to either assist you, or connect you to the appropriate person to support you. Class Teacher

If you have any queries about your child's progress please make contact with the Class Teacher. They will be able to give you detailed information about the progress of your child's learning and how we can work together to support further improvement. They will be able to assist you with wellbeing concerns and any other matters in or out of school that you would like assistance with. Our Class Teachers are always happy to work with our parents and provide feedback and support at any time.

Learning Support Team

The Learning Support Team are a dedicated group consisting of teachers, school counsellors and our Wellbeing Health In Reach nurse (WHIN). This group is focused on providing additional support and targeted interventions to support students that may need a little additional help with their learning and/or wellbeing. They are there to work with students and their families based on a student referral process. Referrals can be made by teachers and/or parents. The Learning Support Team takes a coordinated approach to supporting students by working in collaboration with the class teacher and parents.





Assistant Principals

We have 4 Assistant Principals responsible for the different year groups across the school.

Bonita Broughton - Years 5 and 6

Kate Xenochristou - Support classes and K-6 wellbeing support

Assistant Principals provide support to students, staff and families across all aspects of schooling. This includes learning, curriculum matters, attendance, engagement, wellbeing and discipline. Contact with the Assistant Principal responsible for your child's year group should occur if required following contact with other key personnel outlined above. Contact with an Assistant Principal may also occur in the first instance for a more sensitive or confidential issue with which you need support.

Principal

The Principal is responsible for leading, managing and supporting all aspects of Cooma Public School. This includes support and leadership in the areas of learning, curriculum matters, attendance, engagement, wellbeing and discipline. The principal role includes ensuring effective communication structures and support for students and families as outlined in the previous steps and role descriptions. Contact with the Principal should occur when previous contacts have been made with other key support personnel as outlined above but support is still required. Contact with the Principal may also need to be made in a first instance for more sensitive or confidential situations.

We hope this outline gives our school community stronger clarity around just some of the key people here to provide support. We would encourage parents and caregivers to make regular contact with the school in the ways outlined above so we can all form strong partnerships to support you and your child.





HOW CAN WE HELP?

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Consent

In primary schools, school counsellors and psychologists will seek parent consent prior to engaging with children and beginning any assessment processes. We work in partnership with you to understand the needs of your child(ren) and provide evidence-based, personalised support.

In high schools, students are able to self refer to the school counselling service. However, we endeavour to work with families wholistically and consent will always be sought prior to conducting any assessment processes.



Confidentiality

School counselling is a confidential service and we value the importance of maintaining this. There are however limits to confidentiality, such as when legal requirements, e.g., child protection legislation (risk of harm) require us to share information in the interest of safety and welfare. When working therapeutically with children, confidentiality is also valued and protected and the same limits apply. There may be times when we will recommend information be shared. At these times we will seek your consent before passing on personal information.



Referral

To access school counselling services we encourage you to:

- 1. Speak to your child's teacher if you are concerned about the social, emotional or academic development of your child. Your child's teacher can make a referral to the learning support team and school counsellor on your behalf.
- 2. In times of crisis, contact your school Principal to discuss the needs of your child(ren)/family and a direct referral can be made to the school counsellor.
- 3. If you have any questions about accessing school counselling services for your child(ren), please contact Cooma Public School requesting to speak with a school counsellor.



WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNSELLOR?

Tash Bryceson and Zea Helman School Counselling Service, Cooma PS

The NSWDEC School Counselling Service is a statewide school based service that provides support to students, their families and school communities. The Snowy Monaro School Counselling team is made up of school counsellors and school psychologists. In NSW, school counsellors hold qualifications in teaching (primary or secondary) and psychology and school psychologists hold qualifications in psychology. Teams are coordinated at the regional level by a Senior Psychologist, Education. Together, our team of 8 school counsellors and psychologists support more than 4500 students across 14 primary and high schools from Jindabyne to Queanbeyan. We work collaboratively with students, families, teachers, Principals and multidisciplinary learning support teams to provide a range of services including individual and small group intervention, crisis response, psychological and academic assessment, mental health and wellbeing programs and disability and learning support.
